# Secondary School

As this is your child's final year of primary school, hopefully some thought has been made regarding a secondary school. # Grade 6 Hoodies & Polo Shirts

The Grade 6 students have the opportunity to order a unique hoodie or polo shirt to celebrate their final year of primary school. These are not compulsory though are typically a very popular and practical memento of their time at school. We have had an outstanding number of families take advantage of our early order process last year, and will shortly begin a final opportunity to order these items directly through Noone Hoppers Crossing store (54 Old Geelong Rd, Hoppers Crossing) with receipt due early Term 2. Please note that the school's uniform policy will apply: "Hoods on the 'hoodies' are to be worn off the head whilst at school." Of course, students may wear that hood out of school hours, such as to/from school.

#### Interschool Sport

Students in Grade 6 will participate in summer and winter sports competition against other schools at the end of term. This competition will run through the course of Term 1, with weekly practise to prepare our teams for a single day carnival, which decides district champions. Permissions and costs will be uploaded to Compass for both term's competitions in the next week.

## INQUIRY in Term 1: The Changing Colonies

During Term 1, students will be looking at Australian history and changes to the colony leading to Federation of Australia. Students will learn about the development of Australia, changes in daily life of the people and reasons for the creation of Australia as a single country.

## ENGLISH in Term 1:

During reading in Term 1, students will develop their reading comprehension strategies and skills, interpreting and presenting their thoughts across different fiction and non-fiction text types. This will include expressing and supporting opinions, oral presentations, research and relevant note taking. Our writing units will complement these to include personal recount,





explanation and persuasive writing, and an ongoing focus on developing increasing complexity in drafted writing tasks.

## MATHEMATICS in Term 1:

Students will work at an ability-based level, consolidating and developing their understanding in number and the application to a variety of mathematical problems. We will continue work with regular problem-solving and application of skills in changing situations. Focus areas for this term will include place value, operations, temperature and problem-solving strategies.

We look forward to working in partnership with you this year and having a very successful 2024.
