RESPECTFUL RELATIONSHIPS

Respectful Relationships is an initiative to support schools and early childhood education settings promote and model respect and equality. It also supports educators to teach our children how to build healthy relationships, resilience and confidence.

THE RESILIENCE PROJECT

The Resilience Project is a means of promoting positive mental health through practising gratitude, empathy, resilience and emotional literacy. P-6 classes engage in weekly lessons, which involve students completing an associated journal activity. The Resilience Project lessons align with the Victorian Curriculum and address aspects of: Personal and Social Capabilities and Health and Physical Education learning areas. INQUIRY in Term 1: My Happy Start to School

In Prep, students participate in sessions called Investigations. These are play based learning sessions that encourage children's natural desire to engage in experiences based on their interests, strengths and developing skills. When children initiate play, they are more motivated to learn and develop positive attitudes towards learning and then produce more valuable pieces of work. This term we will be focusing on introducing students to school life at Bellbridge.





ENGLISH in Term 1:

Our focus for Term 1 reading is learning to love reading, letter knowledge and concepts of print. In writing, we will be focusing on fine motor skills, letter sounds and word building. In both reading and writing, we will be incorporating our phonics program Little Learners Love Literacy. In speaking and listening, we will be focusing on oral language skills.

MATHEMATICS in Term 1:

Our focus in mathematics is position and location, shape, number and patterns/sorting.
