Task

Focus: Inferencing

Inferencing is when we use the information we have been given in a text to draw conclusions. Writers do not always give us every detail and sometimes we have to work out an answer on our own, based on the clues given.

Focus: Exposition (persuasive writing)

Task

Focus: Ordering numbers

Activity:

UNO Place Value War (for 2 players)

You will need:

Set of UNO/SkipBo cards (no picture or double-digit cards - e.g. 12)

or

You can use a pack of playing cards with the picture cards removed.

Deal out the cards into 6 piles - 3 piles for each person to represent hundreds, tens and ones. Each player turns over their first 3 cards (one from each pile). Whoever has the highest number wins and collects all the cards. (see picture below.)



The winner is the player at the end with the most cards.
