STUDENT REPORTS

If you have any queries about your child's report, please arrange a mutually convenient time with the classroom teacher to discuss these. Early in Term 1, there will be an opportunity to meet your child's 2021 teacher and share information about your child.

Compass website: Click on "View Academic Reports" and choose "2020 – Semester 2 Report".

Compass app: Tap the student's profile (photo) then "Reports" tab and choose "2020 – Semester 2 Report".

From Wednesday 16th December, parents who have not been able to access the report on Compass may request a printed copy from the office or class teacher – by noting the student's name and grade with a written request for a printed hardcopy. It will then be sent home with the child once printed.



COMPASS

One FAMILY LOGIN CODE is provided per home address for parents/guardians. Where both parents live with a student, they share the same login. Separated parents living in different addresses may wish to have a unique login code for each parent. To arrange this, an "alternative family" form should be obtained from the school office.

SCHOOL COUNCIL REPORT

Our recent School Council held on Monday, November 16th included the following:

- A presentation was made by our School Captains, as well as a proposal they submitted regarding the possible training and implementation of a program involving students as Peer Mediators in the yard during recess and lunch times.
- Presentation of the monthly financial report, including operating statements in relation to expenditure, program budgets – all approved and motions accepted.
- Correspondence was presented and discussed.
- Finance Meeting included the presentation and approval of the Indicative Budget for 2021 and an explanation regarding the reduced funding being allocated to our school due to a significant increase in the level of parent education and occupations recorded on enrolment forms – this results in a perception that our families are less disadvantaged than in the past and we therefore qualify for less funding to support educational programs. As a result, we are no longer able to implement LLI (Levelled Literacy Intervention) and GRIN (Getting Ready in Numeracy) programs which have supported students with additional learning needs.
- Presentation of the Principal's Report re: Staffing, Student Learning & Engagement, School Accountability and Community.
- School Councillors were thanked for their work this year which included most meetings held online via Webex. They have been an extremely supportive group who have provided honest, constructive and open-minded opinions, as well as sharing their realistic parent perspective during this challenging year.

Our next School Council meeting will be in February 2021.

A parent nomination and election process for School Councillors will happen in February and our 'new' 2021 School Council will meet in March.

HAPPY HOLIDAYS

While we still have a little over one week remaining, this is our final newsletter for 2020, so we take this opportunity to wish everyone associated with the Bellbridge Primary School community a happy and safe holiday with much awaited family gatherings and celebrations.

We are so proud of how our community has worked together to manage the ever-changing restrictions and procedures of a very challenging year. TERM 1 2021

The first day of school at Bellbridge PS in 2021 for all students is Thursday 28th January. Teachers will start the year on Wednesday 27th January with a full day dedicated to preparation and professional learning (Curriculum Days).

Prep students will have an altered schedule for four Wednesdays – from 3rd Feb until 24th February inclusive. For these four Wednesdays, Prep assessments and parent meetings will be underway, with Prep students only required at school for their designated day/time.



AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

TUTOR LEARNING INITIATIVE: Information for Parents, carers and families

This information is for parents, carers and guardians about the Tutor Learning Initiative, which will support students in their learning in 2021.

The 2020 school year has been an extraordinary and challenging one for every school community. Many Victorian students spent much of Terms 2 and 3 this year learning remotely and Victorian schools and their communities have made an exceptional effort to provide continuity of teaching and learning to our students during this time.

During Term 4, schools across Victoria have been focused on supporting students' mental health and wellbeing, in addition to assisting students to readjust to on-site learning. Teachers have also been focusing on assessing student learning, addressing individual learning gaps and identifying those students who need extra support for their learning, using classroom-based observation and assessments. We know that the remote learning experience was different for every student. While some students thrived, some students may not have engaged as fully with remote learning. For most of our students, regular high-quality teaching in 2021 will be enough to help them progress to the expected level of learning. Some students will benefit from additional intensive learning support in 2021.

As you may be aware, in response to this, the Victorian Government is investing \$250 million in the Tutor Learning Initiative to enable schools across Victoria to engage around 4,100 teachers as tutors in 2021 to support students who need extra assistance with their learning. Schools will determine how this initiative is best implemented for their students and will ensure that students will get this support in a way that minimises disruptions to other learning or school activities.

By engaging additional teachers to support children with intensive learning, classroom teachers will have greater capacity to ensure that all other students' achievement, engagement and wellbeing needs are met, so that all students receive the support they need in 2021.

Further information about the Tutor Learning Initiative, and how it will be implemented for students who need individual learning support in our school, will be issued before students begin tutoring in 2021. During Term 4, schools will be working with students to understand their experience of remote learning and their return to onsite schooling.

If you are concerned about your child's engagement in their learning, while learning at home or following their return to school, please contact your school.

PLEASE NOTE: At Bellbridge PS, we have been fortunate to have appointed four experienced teachers as our Tutors for next year. Early next term, we will inform parents of how this program will be implemented to support the needs of our students.
